



About Vocational Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation programs are federally designated, state-operated agencies designed to ensure that millions of Americans with disabilities are given the right to pursue meaningful employment.

Each state has a vocational rehabilitation agency that operates a comprehensive vocational rehabilitation program designed to provide counseling, evaluation and job placements services for eligible individuals with disabilities.

Services can include:

- Assessment to determine eligibility
- Vocational and other types of post-secondary education and training
- Rehabilitation technology services
- Job accommodations
- Employer education on disability issues
- Physical and mental rehabilitation services (like eye examinations, speech therapy, mental health treatments)
- Transportation related to vocational rehabilitation services
- Transition services to assist students with disabilities with the transition from school to work

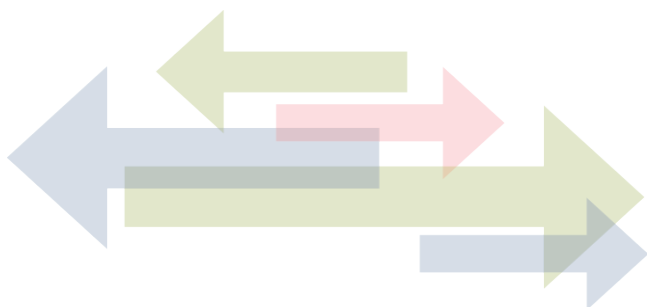
Individuals must meet the following eligibility standards:

- Have a physical, mental emotional or learning disability that is a barrier to getting a job
- Need vocational rehabilitation services to get, keep, or regain employment
- Be able to benefit from the services provided

Individuals who receive Supplemental Security Income or Social Security Disability Insurance are considered eligible, as well as students who receive special education services, receive accommodations in school or who have a significant health condition.
